OVER TWO THOUSAND MAYORS FROM FIFTY-FOUR
COUNTRIES CALL FOR THE IMMEDIATE RELEASE
OF NELSON MANDELA AND OTHER
SOUTH AFRICAN POLITICAL PRISONERS

Note: A Declaration calling for the immediate and unconditional release of Nelson Mandela and other South African political prisoners detained for their political views under the apartheid laws, has now been signed by 2,225 Mayors from 54 countries.

The Declaration was initiated by Mr. Michael Kelly, the Lord Provost of Glasgow, at a meeting of the Special Committee against Apartheid on 12 October 1981.

I. NELSON MANDELA: A PRINCE AMONG POLITICAL PRISONERS

Statement by H.E. Alhaji Yusuf Maitama-Sule, Chairman of the Special Committee against Apartheid and Permanent Representative of Nigeria to the United Nations on the twentieth anniversary of the arrest of Nelson Mandela (5 August).

Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela was arrested twenty years ago - on August 5, 1962 - for going underground to lead the campaign against the establishment of a racist republic by decision of white voters only and for leaving South Africa without a passport to meet the Heads of State and other leaders of newly-independent African countries. He was sentenced in November to six years imprisonment. While in prison, he was again brought to trial as accused number one in the "Rivonia Trial" and was sentenced in June 1964 to life imprisonment.

The statements he made from the dock in November 1962 and April 1964 are among the greatest documents in humanity's struggle for freedom and racial equality.

Mr. Mandela told the court in November 1962:

"I hate the practice of race discrimination, and in my hatred I am sustained by the fact that the overwhelming majority of mankind hate it equally ...

"Nothing that this court can do to me will change in any way that hatred in me, which can only be removed by the removal of the injustice and inhumanity which I have sought to remove from the political, social and economic life of this country."

He told the court in April 1964:

"During my life time I have dedicated myself to the struggle of the African people. I have fought against white domination and I have fought against black domination. I have cherished the ideal of a democratic and free society in which all persons live together in harmony and with equal opportunities. It is an ideal which I hope to live for and I hope to achieve. But if need be, it is an ideal for which I am prepared to die."

Nelson Mandela, a descendant of a princely family in the Transkei, joined the liberation movement in 1944 as a young militant espousing a positive action programme to achieve the ideals of the Atlantic Charter. A charismatic leader, he became the volunteer-in-chief of the "Campaign of Defiance of Unjust Laws" in 1952 in which over 8,000 persons courted imprisonment. He was accused in the notorious "treason trial" of the leaders of the people from 1955 to 1961. He led the campaign against the racist republic in May 1961. When that campaign was suppressed by a massive show of force, he became the leader of Umkhonto we Sizwe ("Spear of the Nation"), the underground movement for armed struggle

for liberation.

After twenty years in jail, Nelson Mandela remains the symbol of resistance and the respected leader of the people of South Africa. Many leaders and organizations abroad - including the United Nations, the European Parliament, Heads of State, parliaments, churches and trade unions - have demanded the unconditional release of Nelson Mandela and all other political prisoners.

They have recognized that Nelson Mandela and his colleagues are the true leaders of the people, loyal to the cherished aspirations of humanity, while the rulers of South Africa practice the obnoxious policy of apartheid, a crime against humanity. They have recognized further that there can be no peaceful solution in South Africa without the liberation and leadership of Nelson Mandela.

The Special Committee against Apartheid will launch a world-wide campaign for the release of Nelson Mandela and all other South African political prisoners on the twentieth anniversary of his imprisonment.

II. TEXT OF THE DECLARATION

I, the Mayor of _____ am convinced
of the need to bring about the end of the practice of apartheid
in South Africa. I therefore appeal to the Government of South
Africa to release immediately and unconditionally all prisoners
detained for their political views under their Apartheid Laws.
Release of such prisoners from long years of imprisonment would
help bring about a spirit of reconciliation. I hereby proclaim
my support and feelings of solidarity with political detainees
in South Africa and call in particular for the immediate release
of Nelson Mandela.

Worldwide Campaign for Release of Political Prisoners in SA Nelson Mandela – Prince Among Political Prisoners

Alhaji Yusuff Maitama-Sule, Chairman of the UN Special Committee against Apartheid and Permanent Representative of Nigeria to the United Nations, on the twentieth anniversary of the arrest of Nelson Mandela, announced that the Special Committee was launching a worldwide campaign for the release of the South African leader and all other political prisoners in South Africa.

In a tribute to Nelson Mandela on the occasion, Mr. Maitama-Sule said:

Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela was arrested twenty years ago – on 5 August 1962 – for going underground to lead the campaign against the establishment of a racist republic by decision of white voters only and for leaving South Africa without a passport to meet the heads of state and other leaders of newly-independent African countries. He was sentenced in November to six years imprisonment.

While in prison, he was again brought to trial as Accused Number One in the "Rivonia Trial" and was sentenced in June 1964 to life imprisonment.

The statements he made from the dock in November 1962 and April 1964 are among the greatest documents in humanity's struggle for freedom and racial equality.

Mr. Mandela told the Court in November 1962:

"I hate the practice of race discrimination, and in my hatred, I am sustained by the fact that the overwhelming majority of mankind hate it equally..."

"Nothing that this court can do to me will change in any way that hatred in me, which can only be removed by the removal of the injustice and inhumanity which I have sought to remove from the political, social and economic life of this country".

He told the Court in April 1964:

"During my lifetime, I have dedicated myself to the struggle of the African people. I have fought against white domination and I have fought against black domination. I

have cherished the ideal of a democratic and free society in which all persons live together in harmony and with equal opportunities. It is an

The African National Congress of South Africa has appealed to the world community to campaign for the reversal of the death sentences passed on three ANC freedom fighters by a Pretoria court on 6 August 1982.

In a statement, the ANC Secretary General Alfred Nzo condemned this latest act of "judicial terrorism" by the apartheid regime.

The ANC statement said:

Judicial terrorism has once more reared its ugly head in South Africa. On 6 August 1982, a racist court in Pretoria pronounced death sentences on Thelle Simon Mogoerane (23), Jerry Semano Mosolodi (25), and

Marcus Thabo Motaung (27) – all members of the African National Congress and the people's army – Umkhonto we Sizwe.

It is not the first time for the Pretoria regime to resort to this barbaric measure in an impossible attempt to postpone their inevitable defeat. Like the three patriots who went down the cells singing after the death sentence was pronounced, we say in one voice that we accept the challenge. We warn the racists not to go ahead with their evil intentions. We shall hit back at all fronts with everything at our disposal to accelerate the destruction of the apartheid

colonial system.

We call upon our people to rally around the families of the three comrades. They must initiate a campaign to demand the committal of this sentence and their immediate release.

We also call upon the international community to campaign for the reversal of this extreme sentence and demand that they be accorded prisoner of war status in accordance with the relevant Geneva protocol. The campaigns for the all-round effective isolation of the racist regime should be intensified.

Ceding South African Territory to Swaziland Condemned

The move of the South African government to cede the Ingwavuma region in northern Natal and most of Kangwane to Swaziland has been widely condemned.

The move would mean that one million South African people would lose their citizenship and become Swazis, that is, exiles in Swaziland.

The African National Congress of South Africa in a memorandum to the Government of Swaziland has asked it to renounce the agreement between Swaziland and the Pretoria Regime on Kangwane and Ingwavuma.

The ANC memorandum said:

"The reported agreement between the Government of the Kingdom of Swaziland and the apartheid regime is fraught with grave dangers for the brother people of Swaziland and South Africa. If implemented, it will seriously complicate and impede the struggle for the liberation of South Africa, and transform Swaziland into an ally of the apartheid regime, a regime which is objectively an enemy of the people of Swaziland. Conscious of our responsibilities to the people of South Africa, Southern Africa, and the continent as a whole, we humbly urge the Government of the Kingdom of Swaziland to renounce this agreement and desist from carrying it out."

The memorandum said that since its foundation nearly 20 years ago, the Organisation of African Unity, of which Swaziland is a member, had stood firm on the position that, in the interests of peace and unity, the colonial boundaries delimiting the states of Africa should not be redrawn except by free and mutual consent between the countries and peoples involved. "Experience has shown that where this principle is violated, inter-African conflict and disunity do

inevitably follow. Already this agreement has generated intense animosities between Swazi and Swazi and between Swazi and Zulu, involving millions of African people. This situation gravely undermines the cause of African unity and gives rise to the possibility of fratricidal strife among the African people. This fits in perfectly with the divide and rule strategy of the apartheid regime and can only serve to extend the lease of life of this regime."

The ANC memorandum said:

"An equally disturbing aspect of this agreement is the intention to develop the area along the Indian Ocean, reportedly to be ceded to Swaziland, as a naval base for use by the Western and South African navies. This refers specifically to Kosi Bay. Quite clearly, this is a very dangerous ploy designed to transform Swaziland into a military base for the purpose of terrorising and committing aggression against the rest of independent Africa, policing the Indian Ocean and the South Atlantic in the interest of the Western powers and providing these powers with a base from which they can easily and at the opportune moment, dispatch their military force into South Africa to save the apartheid regime from its inevitable defeat by our liberation movement. As an expression of its intent, the apartheid regime is already building an all-weather road, at the cost of tens of millions of rand, to link Kosi Bay with the rest of the South African road network. We are convinced that the Government of Swaziland, in keeping with its obligations under the Charters of the OAU, the Non-Aligned Movement and the UN will defeat this effort to turn the Kingdom of Swaziland into an enemy of the peoples of Africa, Asia and Latin America and a base which threatens international peace and security."

ANC Activist - Ruth First Murdered

Once more, the fascist Pretoria regime, faced with the evergrowing wrath and revolutionary zeal of the people inside South Africa and increasing isolation internationally, has committed yet another cowardly and dastardly act of murder by assassinating Mrs Ruth First in Maputo, Mozambique on 17 August 1982.

Mrs Ruth First was brutally killed by the South African racist regime and its agents when she opened a parcel bomb at the Eduardo Mondlane University where she was working as a part of her contribution to the efforts of reconstruction in newly independent Mozambique.

She was one of the most outstanding members of the ANC, a journalist of great talent, a writer and revolutionary.

Her murder has been condemned by anti-apartheid movements in many parts of the world.

Ruth First who was a white was born in 1925.

She was charged with treason in the notorious Treason Trial in 1956. She was detained and held in solitary confinement for 117 days in 1963.

A noted journalist, she was the editor of 'Fighting Talk', she was also the Johannesburg editor of the 'Guardian' and 'New Age'.

Her publications include:

1963 - South West Africa - An Exposure of African life and labour under illegal occupation.

1965 - 117 days - a classic account of solitary confinement and other prison experiences.

1970 - Power in Africa: the politics of the coup d'etat

1973 - The S.A. Connection - Western involvement in Apartheid.

Ruth is survived by her husband Joe Slovo, three daughters and her mother.

ideal which I hope to live for and I hope to achieve. But if need be, it is an ideal for which I am prepared to die."

Nelson Mandela, a descendant of a princely family in the Transkei, joined the liberation movement in 1944 as a young militant espousing a positive action programme to achieve the ideals of the Atlantic Charter. A charismatic leader, he became the volunteer-in-chief of the "Campaign of Defiance of Unjust Laws" in 1952 in which over 8,000 persons courted imprisonment. He was accused in the notorious "Treason Trial" of the leaders of the people from 1955 to 1961. He led the campaign against the

racist republic in May 1962. When that campaign was suppressed by a massive show of force, he became the leader of Umkhonto we Sizwe ("Spear of the Nation"), the underground movement for armed struggle for liberation.

After twenty years in jail, Nelson Mandela remains the symbol of resistance and the respected leader of the people of South Africa. Many leaders and organizations abroad - including the United Nations, the European Parliament, heads of state, parliaments, churches and trade unions - have demanded the unconditional release of Nelson Mandela and all other political prisoners.

They have recognized that Nelson Mandela and his colleagues are the true leaders of the people, loyal to the cherished aspirations of humanity, while the rulers of South Africa practise the obnoxious policy of apartheid, a crime against humanity. They have recognized further that there can be no peaceful solution in South Africa without the liberation and leadership of Nelson Mandela.

The Special Committee against Apartheid is launching a worldwide campaign for the release of Nelson Mandela and all other South African political prisoners on the twentieth anniversary of his imprisonment.

Free Mandela and Other Political Prisoners

Twenty years ago, on 5 August 1962, Comrade Nelson Mandela was captured by the police of the apartheid regime. Pretoria has held him captive since that day.

When he fell into enemy hands, Comrade Mandela was working as an underground functionary and leading cadre of the African National Congress and our popular army, Umkhonto we Sizwe. Both of these were already proscribed organisations. To add to his crime, in the eyes of the oppressor, before his arrest, Comrade Nelson had left the country illegally.

Having gone on a tour which took him to a number of African countries and to Europe, he had returned to South Africa, once more illegally. The spirit of defiance well demonstrated by his clandestine existence within South Africa, under the very noses of the South African police and the fact of his coming back to the country, having had the chance to remain abroad in safety, both incensed and embarrassed the Pretoria regime.

Accordingly, as soon as it was known that Comrade Mandela was back in the country, the racist police mounted a massive manhunt which, regrettably, ended in Comrade Mandela's capture. His exploits in eluding the police net had earned him the popular description, the Black Pimpernel.

It is clear that the apartheid regime had hoped that it could use the fact of the ban on the ANC and the imprisonment and exile of our leaders, including Nelson Mandela, Walter Sisulu, Govan Mbeki, Oliver Tambo and others, to impose on our people its own henchmen as our leaders. To effect this scheme, the racist regime vigorously implemented its Bantustan and "separate development" programme, expecting that a combined policy of terror, deceit and bribery would succeed to turn the masses

of our people against their genuine leaders and away from supporting the demands contained in the Freedom Charter.

Twenty years after the arrest of Nelson Mandela and 22 years after the banning of the ANC, the Pretoria regime has had to admit that its hopes remain unfulfilled and that its policy is in shambles. This is because the masses of our people have continued to espouse the slogan. "We Stand by Our Leaders", which was first used in 1956 when 156 of these leaders, including Nelson

World's Mayors Demand Mandela's Release

Over 2,000 mayors of cities in different continents have so far signed the Declaration initiated by the Lord Provost of Glasgow, Mr. Michael Kelly—for the release of Nelson Mandela and other political prisoners in South Africa.

The list of these mayors was released by the United Nations Special Committee against Apartheid and the Centre against Apartheid in New York on 5 August 1982—the twentieth anniversary of the arrest of Nelson Mandela.

Signed Declarations for Mandela's release from mayors throughout the world are still pouring in at the office of the United Nations Special Committee against Apartheid.

Mandela, were arrested and charged with treason.

Today, the democratic forces working legally within South Africa openly and without equivocation, demand that the apartheid regime should talk to such leaders as Nelson Mandela if it genuinely seeks a just and peaceful solution of the South African problem. Only last month,

on the 18th of July, on the occasion of Comrade Mandela's 64th birthday, rallies were held in South Africa where this demand was restated.

At these rallies, the call was also reiterated: Free Mandela and all other political prisoners and detainees. This represents a continuation and heightening of the campaign for the release of all South African political prisoners which, during 1980, within South Africa, spread throughout the country, rallying the masses of the people around the slogan: Free Mandela.

Hundreds of South African and Namibian patriots remain locked up in South Africa's maximum security prisons. As the struggle intensifies, yet more patriots will be captured by the enemy, as Nelson Mandela was captured 20 years ago. They will be subjected to extreme torture by the sadistic fascist police. Many of them will be assassinated as Saloojee, Mdluli, Biko, Muofhe, Aggett and others were murdered at John Vorster Square Police Station and elsewhere. Yet others will be victims of judicial murder as were Yuyisile Mini, Solomon Mahlangu and others.

This situation demands that the international community should further step up its campaign for the immediate and unconditional release of all South African and Namibian political prisoners and detainees and for treating all captured combatants as prisoners of war.

A further task faces the world democratic and peace forces to campaign for the release of the three South African patriots who have illegally been sentenced to death for daring to take up arms in the just struggle for freedom. These are Anthony Tsotsobe, Johannes Shabangu and David Moise. The apartheid monster must not be allowed to destroy these young lives.

The struggle to free all South African and Namibian political prisoners and detainees is an important element in our national and international offensive against the apartheid regime. Let us together, in unity, further intensify this campaign as our own pledge that we shall at all times stand by the genuine leaders of the people of South Africa and Namibia.


